It can write essays and computer code, solve math problems, and much more.

This has resulted in many hours of research and analysis for teachers as they navigate how to approach this new form of plagiarism. Together, we are confident that we will find ways to utilize AI technology as a useful tool, while also training students on the importance of the learning process and academic honesty.
