IT REMINDERS

- Applying <u>stickers to Chromebooks</u> is not allowed. Taking off the protective case repeatedly, which happens if stickers are added, can result in a broken case and a fee will be applied. Excessive stickering of Chromebooks will result in a charge as it takes time to remove these stickers. Also, students should not remove or cover the student name sticker. A removed name sticker will result in a fee. This policy is in the <u>Chromebook User Guide</u>, under Section II.
- If a student has their Chromebook replaced at any time during the year, any issues need to be reported within a week or it could be considered new damage, which could result in a fee.
- Following the Chromebook guidelines will ensure that students get the most out of their academic year and *stay connected*!

READY FOR SCHOOL PROTOCOL

Since 2020, schools have been required to provide *Ready for School Protocol* for families to help navigate student illness and determine when it is appropriate to send them to school. Spectrum's updated *Ready for School Protocol* is included at the end of this communication and is posted on the school website. Please review and check with the Health Clerk at your student's building if you have questions.

HIGH SCHOOL ONLY

FAFSA (FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID)

Free financial aid events are available to Minnesota students and families via Zoom. The series, running on Tuesday evenings in October, is intended for current high school students and will cover general information about the financial aid process, details on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), the Minnesota Dream Act for undocumented students, and other ways to pay for college. Attendees can ask questions in the chat and have them answered during the event by financial aid experts. Students who attend any of the sessions will be entered into a drawing to win a \$500 scholarship (one entry per session attended). Space is limited so register soon! These sessions are offered by the Minnesota Office of Higher Education, Minnesota Department of Education, ECMC The College Place, and Minnesota Goes to College. PARKING PERMIT REMINDERS

All students planning to park at school must purchase a parking permit from the high school office (with payment made through Infinite Campus). 2023-2024 parking permits are red and must be displayed in the vehicle.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: HIGH SCHOOL PICK UP AND DROP OFF INFORMATION

Six weeks into the school year, we have been able to observe traffic patterns and some unsafe practices have emerged as people are trying to expedite the drop-off and pick-up process – especially for high school students.

In order to create the safest conditions possible, we are asking for your help:

- If dropping off or picking up students at the high school, please enter Industrial Circle off of Twin Lakes Road at the north entrance. This will avoid trying to turn left across traffic into the high school parking lot.
- DRIVE SAFELY
- Please do not drop students off while in the driving lanes on Industrial Circle and avoid pulling into the bus lane. There are two choices for dropping off high school students: (1) on the west side of Industrial Circle before the high school entrance, or (2) turning right into the high school parking lot and using the drop off lane.

DAILY "READY FOR SCHOOL" REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS Updated: August 23, 2023

As part of Spectrum's Preparedness Plan (also referred to as the Safe Return to In-Person Learning Plan), parents/guardians of students attending Spectrum are required to evaluate their child(ren) daily before sending them to school using the following Ready for School Protocol.

READY FOR SCHOOL PROTOCOL

If a student is feeling sick, he or she should stay home until 24 hours after the following symptoms have resolved: fever $> 100^{\circ}$ F (unmedicated), vomiting, diarrhea, or undiagnosed rash.

Other symptoms to consider include the following: sore throat, fatigue, body aches, acute onset of shortness of breath (difficulty or hard time breathing), acute onset or worsening cough (new cough or cough that gets worse), and/or new loss of taste or smell.

The lessening of these symptoms will be required to return to school.

If a student has the above symptoms, the parent/guardian should consider reaching out to their physician to see if an appointment or any testing is suggested. Your student should be ready for a full day of school before returning.

If a student receives a positive influenza test result, please notify your student's health clerk. Students can return to school 24 hours after their fever is gone without the use of fever reducing medication (e.g., Tylenol or Advil). They should also be well enough to participate in a full day of school before returning.

If a student receives a positive COVID test result, please notify the Lead Health Clerk, Jess Lingbeek, as soon as possible: <u>jlingbeek@spectrumhighschool.org</u> or (763) 450-9804. *Note: Free at-home tests are available from the Minnesota Department of Health at https://mn.gov/covid19/get-tested/at-home/*.

What happens after a parent/guardian reports a positive COVID test result?

- (1) A follow up call from the Lead Health Clerk will be made sometime during the first day of notification.
- (2) The Lead Health Clerk will work with the parent/guardian to determine when the student should return to school (at least 5 days from onset of symptoms and when symptoms lessen). Once returning to school, the student will need to wear a mask through the 10th day from onset of symptoms.
- (3) If no test is taken, the student should return to school based on symptoms following the protocol. If coughing, a mask will be encouraged.
