UPDATED "READY FOR SCHOOL" PROTOCOL

The Centers for Disease Control's recent updates of their recommendations for respiratory viruses can be found <u>here</u>. These include changes to covid protocol. As a result, Spectrum has updated its "Ready for School" Protocol. Please see below and contact the Health Clerk at your student's building with any questions.

NEW (UPDATED) "READY FOR SCHOOL" REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS Updated: March 7, 2024

As part of Spectrum's Preparedness Plan (also referred to as the Safe Return to In-Person Learning Plan), parents/guardians of students attending Spectrum are required to evaluate their child(ren) <u>daily</u> before sending them to school using the following Ready for School Protocol.

Ready for School Protocol

If a student is feeling sick, he or she should stay home until 24 hours after the following symptoms have resolved: fever $\ge 100^{\circ}$ F (unmedicated), vomiting, diarrhea, or undiagnosed rash.

Other symptoms to consider include the following: sore throat, fatigue, body aches, acute onset of shortness of breath (difficulty or hard time breathing), acute onset or worsening cough (new cough or cough that gets worse), or new loss of taste or smell.

The lessening of these symptoms will be required to return to school.

If a student has the above symptoms, the parent/guardian should consider reaching out to their physician to see if an appointment or any testing is suggested. Your student should be ready for a full day of school before returning.

Student Dress Code

A. Dress Code Policy

The intent of the Spectrum Dress Code is to provide a safe and productive learning environment with limited distractions. Students should dress for success. Any apparel that is a potential danger to themselves or others is not permitted. Dress for school should be clean and in good condition. If students have any confusion regarding the appropriateness of their attire, they should consult with the office at any time. Students may be required to change clothing at the discretion of the Administration. *Note: Current fashion trends may not meet these guidelines.*

B. Clothing

- 1. **Pants** MUST be worn at an appropriate waist level, and undergarments shall not be seen. If pants have holes or tears through which skin is exposed, these holes shall be located below the end of the fingertips with arms relaxed at sides.
- 2. **Shirts/Tops/Sweaters** shall have necklines, with no cleavage showing, whether sitting or bending over. Sleeveless tops must have at least a 2" strap (no bra straps should show). No halter tops, tube tops, tank tops, or tops with spaghetti straps. Shirts/tops/sweaters should be long enough so that no bellies or backs are exposed.
- 3. **Shorts/Skirts/Dresses** need to be long enough so they extend beyond a student's fingertips when arms are relaxed at sides.
- 4. Coats and jackets are to be left in lockers and are not allowed in the classroom.

5. Message on Clothing

a. Clothing with messages about drugs, alcohol, tobacco, gangs, or racial or sexual connotations are not allowed.

b. Clothing with messages that are lewd, obscene, defamatory, and/or profane are not allowed. c. Emblems, badges, symbols, signs, words, objects, or pictures on clothing or jewelry communicating a message that is racist, sexist, or otherwise derogatory, evidences gang membership or affiliation, or approves, advances, or provokes any form of religious, racial, or sexual harassment and/or violence against others are not permitted.

*It is not the intention of this policy to abridge the rights of students to express political, religious, philosophical, or similar opinions.

- 6. Slippers are not to be worn to school except on designated days during Spirit Weeks.
- 7. Students are asked to be mindful of the amount of **perfume/cologne** being worn due to allergies and out of consideration for others. Spraying perfume/cologne in hallways or other areas is not permitted.
- 8. **Head coverings and sunglasses** (i.e., hats, skullcaps, du rags, scarves, or hoods) and sunglasses are NOT to be worn inside the classroom, at lunch, or anytime during school hours. These items will be confiscated. The only exception is for cultural head coverings, and during designated days during Spirit Weeks.
- 9. **Undergarments** (including bras and boxer shorts) shall not be seen. This includes clothes that do not fit properly, revealing clothing, or transparent clothing.

At all times, students may be required to change clothing at the discretion of Administration. If clothing is found to be inappropriate, Administration will follow Student Discipline Guidelines. If students are unsure as to whether their clothing fits these guidelines, they are encouraged to inquire with the office before wearing them to school. Students may appeal a dress code violation to administration. Spectrum reserves the right to change and adapt dress code as the need arises.
